OUR MISSION

Interfaith Sanctuary Housing Services is a collaboration of people of faith and people of conscience who have joined together to shelter and serve individuals experiencing homelessness. Sanctuary provides overnight shelter for men, women, and children and provides supportive services that promote greater self-sufficiency, improved well-being, and permanent housing acquisition.

Sanctuary offers services to a wide sector of those experiencing homelessness, including two-parent intact families, single father families, and single mother families with a male child over age 12, who are not eligible for emergency shelter services at any other location in Boise. While our target population is men, women, and families who are homeless, other underserved populations are represented in this group, including victims of domestic abuse, persons with mental and/or physical illness, veterans, persons with drug/alcohol abuse issues, and those facing under/unemployment.

Interfaith Sanctuary works collaboratively with all local government, non-profit social service organizations, and many faith communities to help meet the needs of people who are homeless in our community.

A MESSAGE FROM INTERFAITH SANCTUARY PRESIDENT, REV. ED KEENER



For almost two years now, Interfaith Sanctuary's shelter has been at nearly full to full capacity every night. Were this any business but sheltering our homeless sisters and brothers, it would be good news to be this busy. But, of course, it is not good news. This crisis in homeless persons only seems to worsen. And

Sanctuary is very busy. We continue to provide shelter for families with children and single women and men. Some nights we need to be very creative to accommodate everyone. Economists may say that an economic recovery is happening, but you can't tell that by the number of first-time homeless children and their parents at Interfaith Sanctuary. The only statistic they know is that they no longer have a home.

We have been so blessed by you, our generous supporters, volunteers, and staff, that each year of our existence, since 2005, we have been able to provide more and better services to the increasing number of people in need. This kind of generosity astounds me. We are truly a community that cares and shares. Our Xtreme Xtravaganza Holiday Concert, graciously offered by Curtis Stigers and friends, gets bigger each year, bringing in more income for our shelter. As more folks hear about the good work of Interfaith Sanctuary our financial support grows, allowing us to do more.

This year, our Supportive Services Director, Abel Grimaldo, creatively managed a team of BSU social work interns, who helped expand the services we offer. But this program needs even more support in order for our guests to realize their goal of permanent housing. With your generosity, we look to a future in 2013 that adds a half-time professional social worker to our team. And we anticipate the continued support of City of Boise-administered HUD funding to, at last, complete most of our much needed remodeling: more restroom facilities, larger water supply lines, and more functional hospitality areas.

Your Sanctuary Board of Directors continues its active work. We've again received a clean audit of our financial accounting. Our staff, under the direction of Jayne Sorrels, remains judicious with the monies we receive. We are grateful that you trust us to do this important work of saving lives and building better futures.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Our *Emergency Shelter Program* provides overnight shelter for up to 160 men, women and children each night of the year. Shelter services are available from 6:00pm - 7:00am daily, and are supplemented by light dinners provided in partnership with Life's Kitchen and the Idaho Foodbank.

Single men and women have separate sleeping facilities in the shelter while sharing a common dining/recreation hall. Families are housed in another section of the shelter and share their own hospitality room.

2012 Program Highlights:

- Provided 54,936 bednights and meals
- Served 528 adults and 142 children

Our **Supportive Services Program** is offered to shelter guests or those at risk of becoming homeless. Access to basic needs, case management, and individual counseling are available. Other Supportive Services activities that guide people towards permanent housing acquisition, include:

Disability Support assists disabled individuals to apply for and access medical benefits;

Family Strengthening emphasizes healthy family functioning through case management, parenting classes, and structured educational activities for children;

Homeward Bound offers tenant behavior education, mentoring, resource meetings, and a network of available financial resources to expedite housing acquisition;

Ready to Work provides a pathway to self-sufficiency through paid employment.

2012 Program Highlights:


- 45 resumes were completed, with 20 people obtaining employment
- 80 individuals or households were referred to transitional housing programs
- 40 applications for supplemental security income or disability benefits were filed

Interfaith Sanctuary programs are supported by our essential Community Volunteer Program. Volunteers work alongside shelter guests and staff to provide support where necessary. In addition, numerous volunteer groups complete special projects throughout the year to help improve our shelter facility.

2012 Program Highlights:

- Approximately 5,000 volunteer hours were served, with 40 shifts per week filled by community volunteers
- Volunteer groups contributed in-kind donations, services, and special events totaling over \$50,000
