

## OUR MISSION

Interfaith Sanctuary Housing Services is a collaboration of people of faith and people of conscience who have joined together to shelter and serve individuals experiencing homelessness. Sanctuary provides overnight shelter for men, women, and children and provides supportive services that promote greater self-sufficiency, improved well-being and permanent housing acquisition.

Sanctuary offers services to a wide sector of those experiencing homelessness, including two-parent intact families, single father families, and single mother families with a male child over age 12, who are not eligible for emergency shelter services at any other location in Boise. While our target population is men, women, and families who are homeless, other underserved populations are represented in this group, including victims of domestic abuse, persons with mental and/or physical illness, veterans, persons with drug/alcohol abuse issues, and those facing under/unemployment. Interfaith Sanctuary works collaboratively with all local government, non-profit social service organizations, and many faith communities to help meet the needs of people who are homeless in our community.

## SUPPORTIVE SERVICES PROGRAM

Our programs are offered to shelter guests or those at risk of becoming homeless. Access to basic needs, case management, and individual counseling are available. Additional Supportive Services programs that guide people towards permanent housing acquisition, include:

Disability Support assists individuals with disabilities to apply for medical benefits.

Family Strengthening emphasizes healthy family functioning through case management, parenting classes, and structured educational activities for children.

Homeward Bound offers case management, mentoring, resource meetings, and a network of available financial resources to expedite housing.

Ready to Work provides a pathway to self-sufficiency through paid employment. Sanctuary programs are supported by our essential Community Volunteer Program. Volunteers work alongside shelter guests and staff to provide support where necessary. In addition, numerous volunteer groups complete special projects throughout the year to help improve our shelter facility.

A MESSAGE FROM INTERFAITH SANCTUARY  
PRESIDENT, REV. ED KEENER

It seems like we've been in remodeling and construction mode forever. The building into which we moved in 2007 needed complete remodeling in order to become the adequate facility we wanted. One by one the improvements clicked off the list.

We're just about finished with the necessary changes and additions, but not quite. Still needed is the upgrade of the water supply to provide adequate water to all the needed showers as well as for laundry purposes and then the shower facilities for women and families can be installed.

Along the way shelter guests have been patient and understanding. Staff has worked in awkward circumstances. Volunteers witnessed steady change. We are so grateful to Bill Hamlin and Chris Vondemkamp, our architects and Nick Guho, our construction consultant as well as construction workers throughout this process. They have been invaluable to our board in knowing what makes the most sense at the best possible price.

Almost all of the funding for construction remodeling has come from HUD funding administered by the City of Boise. All the while we've been able to provide quality shelter and more and more social services to help our homeless guests find ways to exit homelessness.

And that brings up the second piece on which I comment. Exiting from homelessness is never a simple nor easy task. It rarely occurs from a "just pull yourself up by your own bootstraps" effort. When most find themselves in homelessness they also find themselves without bootstraps. In most cases any other options have gone away including self-confidence, positive self-image and too often good mental health. These are the very reasons our social workers Abel and Karen as well as the good energy of our staff and volunteers are so essential. These provide the coaching, assurance and extra help needed to complete the necessary paperwork for health services, housing applications, public support when required, and job searches.

You, our financial, volunteer and prayer supporters, are essential in the total effort to help lift the homeless families, single women and single men out of homelessness. Without your support we would not even exist, let alone be successful in this effort. Your faithfulness in joining our cause keeps us going. You are the blessed of our community.

May you have a joyful and thankful spring knowing you are making a difference in our community.

## Programs and Services

Our *Emergency Shelter Program* provides overnight shelter for up to 160 men, women and children each night of the year. Shelter services are available from 6:00pm – 7:00am daily, and are supplemented by light dinners provided in partnership with Life’s Kitchen and the Idaho Foodbank. Single men and women have separate sleeping facilities in the shelter while sharing a common dining/hospitality room. Families are housed in another section of the shelter and share their own hospitality room.

### 2013 Program Highlights:

- Provided 60,182 bednights and meals
- Served 878 individuals (707 adults and 171 children)
- 100 individuals or households were referred to transitional housing programs
- 40 applications for supplemental security income or disability benefits were filed
- Approximately 5,000 volunteer hours were served, with 40 shifts per week filled by community volunteers

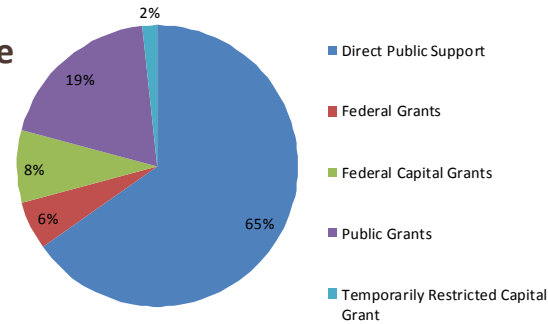

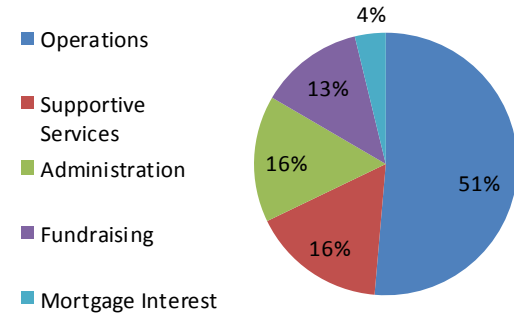
